- ✦ The law passed by the Texas Legislature restructuring the state's electricity industry gave utilities certain energy efficiency goals to meet.
- ✦ As a result, most electric utilities in Texas are providing incentives to energy efficiency service contractors for the installation of certain energy efficiency measures that result in electricity savings.
- ✦ Work can be done at homes and businesses within a utility's service area.
- ✦ AEP has contracts with national and local firms who may contact you about performing work to help save energy and reduce your electric bill.
- ✦ **You decide** what equipment will be installed and **you choose** what work the contractor you select will do.
- ✦ **You and your contractor** determine price, warranty and other issues.

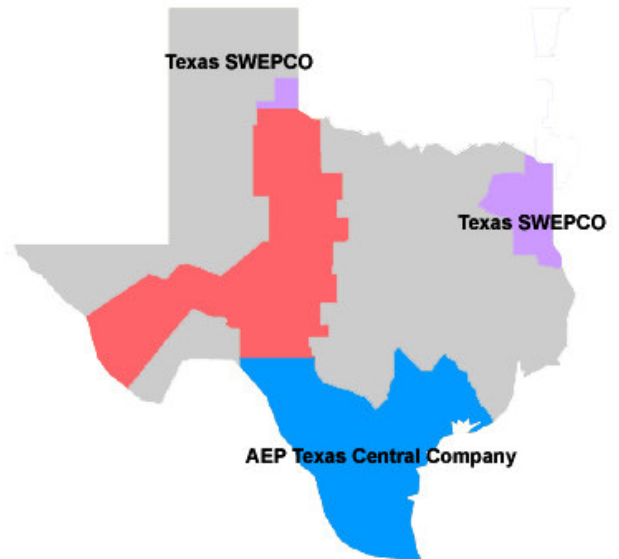

As a consumer:

- ✦ Be sure you understand the terms of any agreement before signing and know how much you will pay.
- ✦ Request a copy of all paperwork.
- ✦ You have 72 hours (3 days) to cancel any agreement (called Right of Rescission period).
- ✦ Ask for an "All Bills Paid Affidavit" if a subcontractor is used.
- ✦ An AEP representative may contact you to verify the work was done.
